A cat's tale! - Finding Fifi a home

Fifi was a small, multi-coloured cat with short hair. She lived in a house with lots of other cats. Her owners were an elderly couple who had bought Fifi's parents, Max and Minnie.

They didn't realise the brother and sister would have their own kittens until it was too late and they suddenly had five hungry mouths to feed, including Fifi. Four months later Minnie had another six kittens and Fifi's two sisters had four kittens each.



Fifi didn't like most of the other cats so tried to keep away from them as much as possible, but this was difficult as they had to share food and water bowls, places to sleep and even a stinky litter tray. Sharing these things sometimes ended in fighting and always made Fifi feel unhappy as she couldn't choose to have her own space. Fifi coped by washing herself repeatedly with her rough tongue until she got bald patches in her coat.



One day there was a knock at the door. It was the couple's grandson Bill. He was surprised to see so many cats as the last time he had come round there had only been two! He took Max and Minnie to the vet for an operation to stop them having more kittens. Bill then took Fifi and all her brothers, sisters, nieces and nephews to a Cats Protection centre to find them new homes.

When Fifi arrived, the staff separated her from the other cats except from her brother Tom because they liked curling up to sleep together and licking each other. A vet checked them over and gave them medicine to get rid of fleas and worms. The vet microchipped them so they could be found if they got lost and gave them injections to stop them getting illnesses like cat flu. So Fifi and Tom didn't end up with lots of their own kittens, they also had a simple operation.

A few weeks later, Fifi and Tom met a boy and his father at the centre. They blinked slowly at

the cats to show they wanted to be friends and let them sniff their hands before stroking them. They adopted the two cats who now live a happy life in their own home. Their owners gave them three food and water bowls, scratching posts, beds and litter trays (an item each plus a spare). This meant they could always eat, drink, scratch, sleep and toilet away from each other.



Fifi's soft fur has grown back and she spends her time playing in the garden in the sun and snoozing on her bed by the sofa.

How to make a cat scratching post

Materials you need

- Carpet
- Tubing
- Cable ties
- A spare pair of hands to help!





Method

- 1. Place the carpet on a flat surface, with the carpet backing facing upright.
- 2. Place the tubing onto the carpet and roll the carpet around the tube.
- 3. Hold the tube and carpet securely. Ask your helper to place cable ties at either end to secure the carpet into place.
- 4. Now attach the scratching post to something secure using more cable ties.
- 5. Hint: cats are territorial and like to mark territory when entering a building or after waking! Think carefully about where is best to place the new scratching post.
