Materials you need

- An egg box
- Cat biscuits
- Newspaper





Method

- Open the egg box and place the cat biscuits at the bottom of each egg holder.
- 2. Tear the newspaper into long strips and crumple into several newspaper balls.
- 3. Place the newspaper balls into each of the egg holderscovering the cat biscuits.
- Let your cat solve the puzzle! (At first you may need to show your cat the answer to avoid frustration).
- 5. Hint: use treats occasionally and take away from daily rations.
