Vet Care

Health and wellbeing.

Mice are generally healthy little pets, but always keep an eye out for any changes in their behaviour, and take them to a vet if you're worried. They may suffer from itchy mites if kept on sawdust, so shredded paper is best.



Normal behaviour

Keep your pet happy.

Put some kitchen roll tubes or a small branch from an apple or willow tree in a mouse house, and watch them eagerly climb up! Mice like being busy and exploring, so rotate their toys daily to keep them mentally stimulated.



Why not make your own mouse food?

Mix together: 6 scoops of rabbit/ rat muesli, 1.5 scoops of dog biscuits, a handful of healthy seeds, nuts, dried fruit or dried noodles, 3 scoops of healthy, low sugar breakfast cereal like cheerios and half a scoop of uncooked wholemeal pasta.
